

KEEP YOUR FAMILY SAFE BY MAKING YOUR HOME SMOKE-FREE



- Do not allow anyone to smoke inside your home.
- If your lease includes a smoke-free policy, make sure you and your guests follow the policy.
- Protect your family from smoke-related fires by making sure that people:
 - Do not smoke within 20 feet of the building.
 - Never smoke near things that can burn, such as bark mulch or planters.
 - Safely dispose of smoking materials in non-combustible containers filled with water or sand.
- Tell homeowner or management if you see:
 - Someone not following the property's policy regarding smoking.
 - People disposing of smoking products on the ground or putting them out in planters.
 - Overflowing cigarette butt containers.
- If loved ones use medical oxygen, make sure they don't ever smoke when using oxygen, and make sure others don't smoke around them.
