

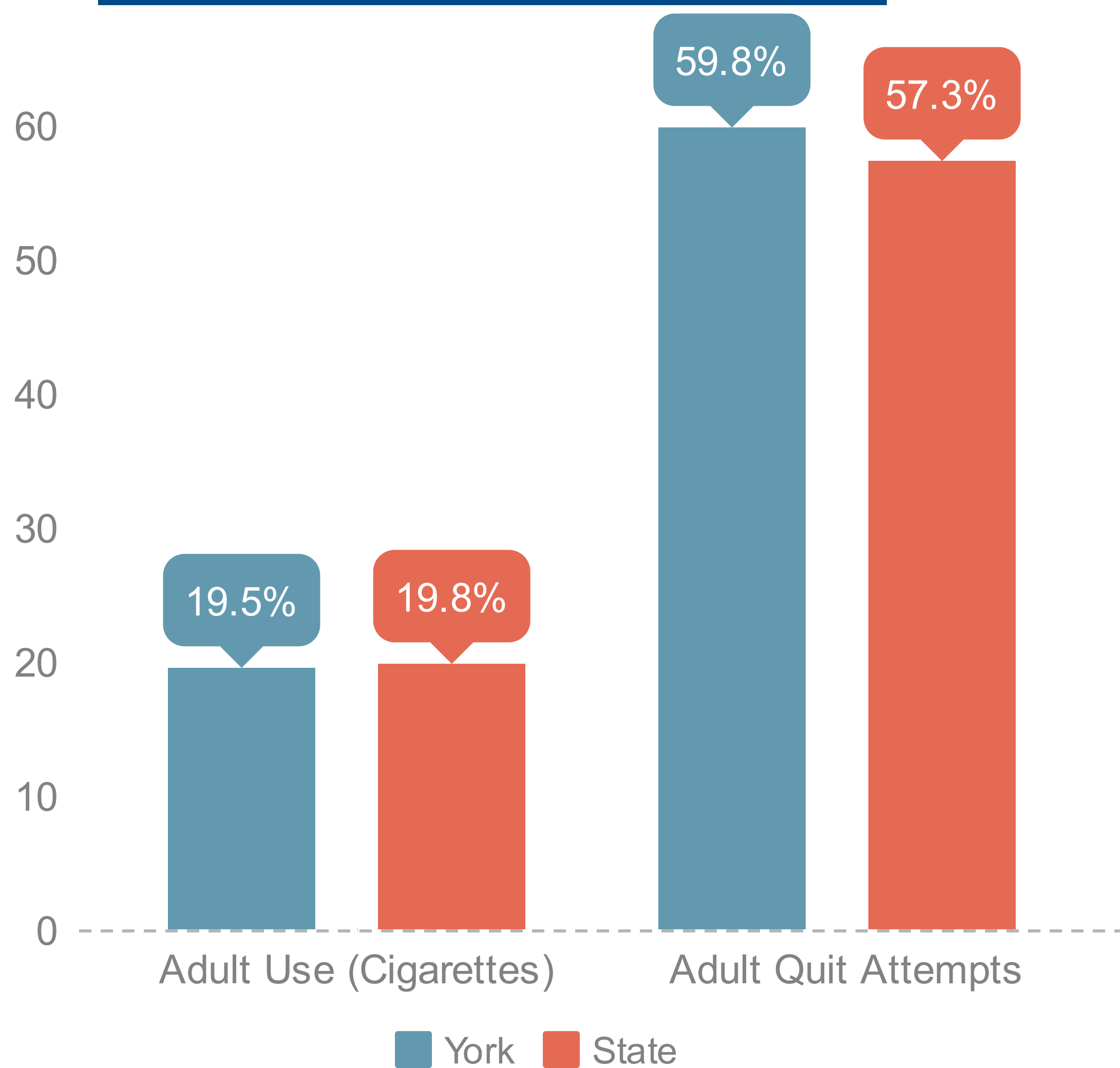

Maine's 1st Public Health District is York, and includes York County. The York District has an estimated population of 200,536 and includes 29 municipalities; the median income is \$59,132 and 9.4% of individuals live in poverty.

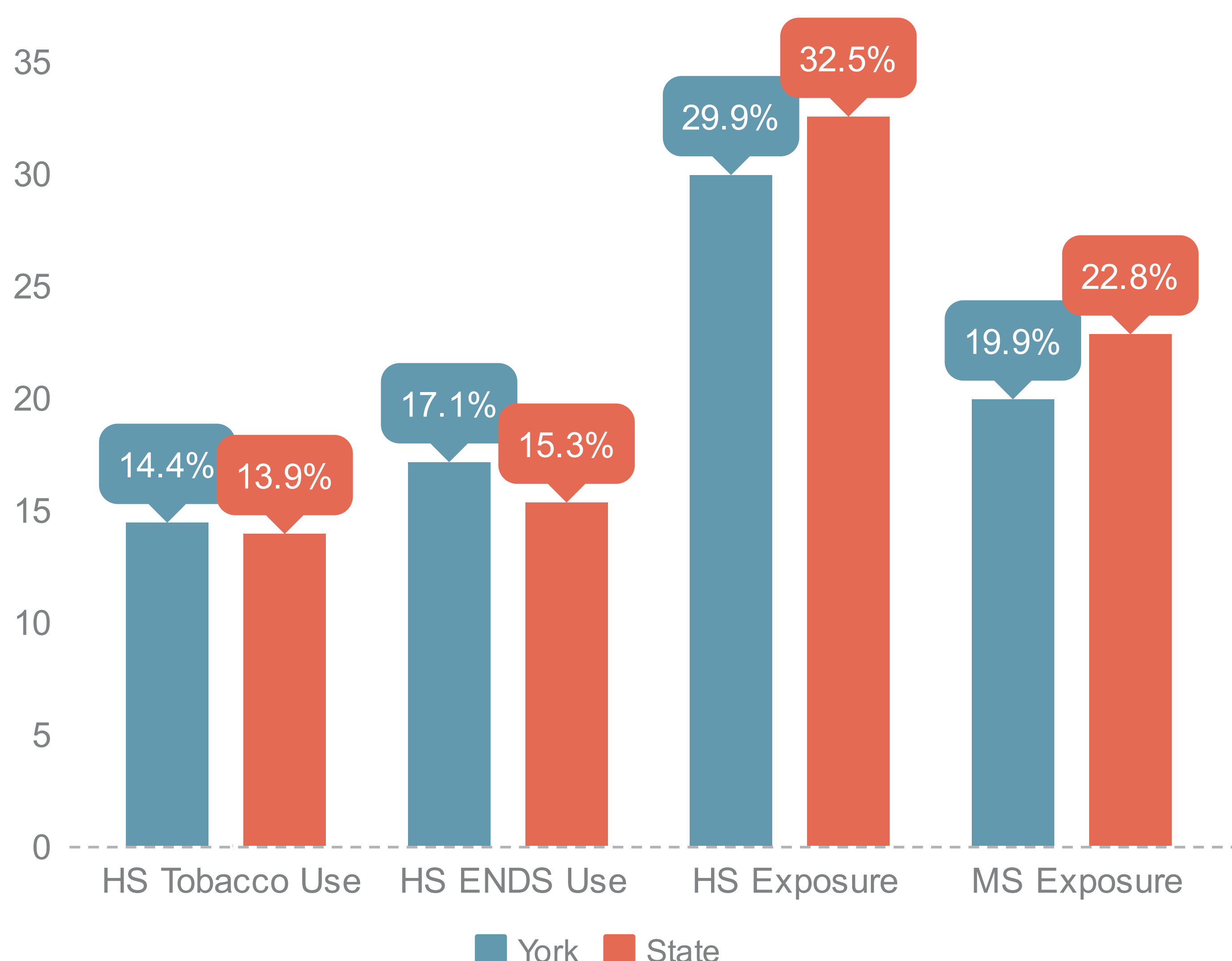

Smoke and Tobacco-Free Policies Implemented:

Behavioral Health: 1 policy passed for an organization that has 6 employees and 120 clients.

Hospitals: 1 policy passed for a hospital with 2,129 employees and 150 patient beds.

Multi-Unit Housing: 3 policies passed that cover 6 buildings with 56 units and 90 tenants.

Municipalities: 2 policies passed for municipalities with a combined population of 25,612, including one point-of-sale policy.

Schools: 1 policy passed for a school with 1,091 enrolled students and 213 employees.

Youth-Serving Entities: 8 policies passed for organizations serving 207 youth and with 36 employees.
