



Smoke and Tobacco-Free Policies Implemented:

Behavioral Health: 3 policies passed for organizations with 184 employees serving 1,190 clients.

<u>Higher Education:</u> 1 policy passed for a school serving 4,400 students and 138 employees.

<u>Lodging:</u> 3 policies passed for establishments with 34 guest rooms and 13 employees.

<u>Multi-Unit Housing:</u> 7 policies passed that cover 96 buildings with 2,685 units and 4,311 tenants.

<u>Municipalities:</u> 2 policies passed a municipalities with a population of 20,987.

Schools: 3 policies passed for schools with 7,980 enrolled students and 1,660 employees.

Youth-Serving Entities: 6 policies passed for organizations serving 176 youth and with 43 employees.
